Welcome to IMSH 2027

Every discipline in healthcare simulation works in its own room most of the year — educators in one building, operations specialists in another, researchers publishing to a different audience than the one running the manikins. For five days every January, IMSH puts all of it in one room.

IMSH is a scientific conference built on peer-reviewed content, not vendor pitches. It brings together educators, researchers, operations specialists, clinicians, program directors, engineers, and students to explore what's next in simulation-based healthcare training — and to bring it home to the patients your program ultimately serves.

IMSH 2027 carries the theme **In Concert** — a nod to New Orleans, the city that invented jazz, and to the way the best simulation outcomes actually happen: not through any one discipline working alone, but through teams reading each other, adapting in real time, and elevating the whole. That's the case this toolkit is built to help you make.

THE SHORT VERSION

SSH is the world's leading interprofessional society advancing healthcare simulation — through credentialing, accreditation, education, research, and advocacy — in service of better patient outcomes.

Why IMSH: The Case for Going

Here's the problem nobody puts in the budget request: simulation moves fast, and most programs experience that speed secondhand — through a vendor email, a colleague's LinkedIn post, a journal article that's already a year old by the time it's cited. By the time a new technique, standard, or piece of equipment reaches your program through those channels, the programs that were in the room already have a year's head start.

IMSH is the room. It's the one week a year where the standards get set, the research gets presented before it's published, and the people building the field's next equipment and curricula are standing at a booth ready to talk shop — not sell.

What that costs a program that skips it: a widening gap between what your team knows and what the field now expects. Recertification and CE credit that has to be found somewhere else, less efficiently. A professional network that stops growing. And, eventually, a program that looks a step behind the peers who kept showing up.

What attending actually delivers:

- **Reviewed by people who do the work.** Every session is vetted by working simulationists — practitioners running programs like yours — so what you sit in on is current to the job, not theoretical.
- **IPCE credit that counts.** Interprofessional Continuing Education credit supports recertification and compliance goals in one trip.
- **130+ companies in one hall.** See, touch, and compare the equipment and technology your next budget cycle depends on — before you commit to it sight-unseen.
- **Straight from the people who build it.** Talk directly with the engineers and product teams behind the equipment already in your lab — and catch new simulation products at the What's New in Sim showcase before they reach the public market.
- **A network Zoom can't build.** The relationships formed in a hallway between sessions are the ones that get you a fast answer when a program back home hits a wall in March.
- **No virtual option.** SSH doesn't stream IMSH. This is the one professional development trip that can't be replaced with a recording.

The career grows in the room — not in the recap email that goes around after.

The letter templates in this toolkit are built to make that case in the language your specific supervisor needs to hear — whether the ask is about patient safety, compliance, research output, or the next budget cycle.

New Orleans: The Stage



The "In Concert" theme wasn't picked at random. New Orleans is the birthplace of jazz — an art form built on improvisation, collaboration, and the idea that the best outcomes happen when people perform together, reading each other in real time. That's also, not coincidentally, how the best simulation teams work.

Getting around is easy. The French Quarter is a 12-minute walk from the Ernest N. Morial Convention Center. The Warehouse District — home to the National WWII Museum, rated the #1 museum in the U.S. — is steps away. The St. Charles streetcar runs 24 hours for \$1.25 a ride.

The food alone is worth the trip report. Beignets at Café du Monde, a James Beard–nominated tasting menu at Cochon four minutes from the convention center, and a jazz brunch tradition that dates to 1893 at Commander's Palace.

What to expect in January. A mild 55°F average, light layers recommended, and one of the city's best months to be outdoors between sessions.

Evenings have their own program. Frenchmen Street runs six live jazz clubs across two blocks, most with no cover charge — a short walk or cab ride from the Quarter.

January in New Orleans isn't just a backdrop for IMSH 2027. It's the point.

THE DEADLINE THAT MATTERS MOST

Early-bird pricing opens September 9, 2026 and closes October 15, 2026. After that, the member rate rises to \$1,005 — an increase of \$155 for waiting five weeks. Getting the letter signed before mid-October is worth real budget dollars.
